**Master of Buddhist Counselling 2025-2026  
Important Notes for Course Selection**

Please read the following notes carefully before enrolling courses via the online course selection system:

All courses are offered on credit basis. Candidates have to complete a total of 63 credits for graduation. Candidates must complete THREE compulsory core courses (9 credits each), FOUR elective courses (24 credits in total), and the Capstone Experience (12 credits).

**Compulsory core courses and elective courses**

1. Please refer to the [dates of semester](#) for the course enrollment period, add/drop period, and assessment period. The finalized examination timetable will be available online in November 2025 and April 2026.
2. During the course enrollment period and add/drop period, students can attend ANY classes without registration (except for BSTC7611). To finalize course selection, please complete online course selection by the deadline. Please enroll in courses for both 1st and 2nd semesters (recommended). For the enrollment method of BSTC7611, please refer to No. 5.
3. Please log in [HKU Portal](#) to access the online course selection system. Please visit here for the [user guide](#). New students must complete **Master Registration** before performing online course selection.
4. Part-time students are highly recommended to **complete all the three compulsory core courses in Year 1** to lay a solid foundation for enrolling in other elective courses and the Capstone Experience in their final year.
5. There is class size quota for *BSTC7611 Group work in Buddhist and traditional counselling* (maximum intake: **16**). Details are:

<i>Criteria</i>	As advised by the course teacher, students <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. <b>must attend the first class on September 2, 2025;</b></li><li>2. need to attend a minimum of 80% of all lectures</li></ol>
<i>Ballot system</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- If the course is over-subscribed, the places will be allocated by ballot system (through a random computer ballot system).</li><li>- Priority will be given to the following groups: Full-time, Part-time Year 2 and final year students.</li></ul>
<i>Result</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Students will be notified of their results via email on or before <b>6:30 pm, September 8, 2025 (Mon)</b>.</li><li>- Those who do not get a place will be put on the waiting list.</li></ul>

<i>Confirmation of Enrollment</i>	- Students on the waiting list will be notified on or before <u>6:30 pm, September 12, 2025 (Fri)</u> if place is available for them.
<i>Remarks</i>	- No sit-in student is allowed for the course after Sept 16, 2025.

6. Students from the MBC programme will be provided with options to select a maximum of one elective course from the Master of Social Sciences (Counselling) programme during the whole period of study. Enrollment is subject to the availability of quota of the cross-listed courses and the approval from both departments. More details will be announced in September 2025.

#### Capstone Experience

7. The capstone experience is compulsory and is designed for the students to demonstrate their competencies as a Buddhist counsellor while participating in a single original supervised project of the student's choice. Please note that only final year students can enrol in BSTC8998 Capstone Experience. For the enrollment method, please refer to No. 3.
8. Options of Capstone Experience are listed as follows:
- Option A: Contemplative and religious practices in Buddhism
  - Option B: A self-contemplative and reflective autobiography
  - Option C: Buddhist homiletics
  - Option D: Buddhist counselling case study
9. Submission of the Capstone Experience project should be done by July 31 in the final year of study.
10. All Full-time and Part-time final year students must submit the "MBC Capstone Experience Proposal Form" by November 1, 2025. Both hard and soft copies are required:
- Hard copy shall be submitted to the assignment dropbox at our Centre (please put into the box of 'MBC Capstone Experience') outside Room 4.02, 4/F, The Jockey Club Tower, Centennial Campus.
  - Soft copy shall be uploaded to the course Moodle of BSTC8998 Capstone Experience
11. More information will be provided in the workshop on Capstone Experience on September 21, 2025 (Sun), 10:30 am-12:30 pm. Details will be announced in mid-August.
